

## MEMBER SPOTLIGHT – SETH VORE

If you are on Instagram or Facebook, maybe you've seen a guy wearing an @ACBSBOATS t-shirt carrying a microphone. Or seen him in real life interviewing folks in their boats or taking photos or videos for the ACBS. That's our very own CWC member, Seth Vore, who works for the ACBS international office as the Community Engagement Manager (that's a fancy title for the guy that handles social media accounts).

In 2021, Seth answered an ad in the Weekly Web Watch email. He had been doing social media for his own business (Portland Boat Tours) and thought the job they described would be a great way to use those skills to further a hobby he is passionate about with three boats of his own: a 1939 17' Chris-Craft Deluxe Utility "Rosie", a 1948 17' Century Resorter "Rhody", and 1977 36' Californian Trawler "Endeavor." The big idea is to get beautiful boats in front of as many eyes as possible. He interviewed with the ACBS Marketing Committee and the rest is history!

Seth describes one of the perks of this job getting to go places and see things that are unique to this position. Seth attended eight boat shows in 2024, like the Bay Harbor International, Sunnyland, Tahoe, and most recently the International at Gull Lake

The videos and interviews on social media appear seamless. But there are times when bloopers occur. Sometimes the microphone doesn't cooperate, a horn or a loud motor ruins the interview, or the camera falls over. Filming on docks or in boats can be a challenge. Those bloopers are often posted and sometimes they do better online than the real content. One of Seth's posts has gone "viral." He shot a video of "Miss America VIII" firing up in Bay Harbor - it has been viewed over 75 million times! He says he most enjoys talking to folks in person that were previously only interacted with online. He like to meet the faces behind the accounts that he follows.

Seth is very thankful to be able to serve the ACBS in this unique role. The ACBS Board, the Marketing Committee, and the Executive Director have all been very supportive of his work and the new audience they are building online. ## PT BOAT NEWS By Jack Coulter

The PT 658 boat house is getting a long-needed upgrade this spring. The original manually operated sliding doors for the boat house were replaced by a state-of-the-art electric roll-up door. The approximate 21' x 20' steel roll-up door was manufactured by **RS Manufacturing, Inc.** in Portland and is being installed by **Tom Voigt** of Extreme Door, a local installer.

The work could not have been done without the generous help of **Clark** Caffall for procuring and moving the work barge and Vigor Industries for its work loading the 3,800 lb. door, along with the crane and man-lift needed to remove the old door and install the new one. **Don Cameron**, both a CWC-ACBS member and volunteer for the PT boat, acted as project manager leading the door replacement. PT 658 is fortunate to have a group of such willing support service providers and volunteers.

## MAHOGANY IS MAGIC (PART 1) By Mike Stevens

Here is a brief overview of mahogany wood used in boat building. Mahogany trees can grow up to 200 feet tall with trunks that are

branchless for up to 60 feet and are often several feet in diameter. This wood is used to make furniture, musical instruments, and ship parts. Though solid, it is buoyant, and resistant to rot. The wood has a straight, even grain, and is relatively free of interior voids. It has a reddish/brown hue that darkens over time. It is durable and takes beautifully to carving. The value of a mahogany tree depends on its size, grade, and accessibility.

A 60-foot-tall mahogany tree with a 40-inch circumference could be worth around \$36,384. People also use mahogany bark extract and gum for medicinal purposes.

These trees are native to the Bahamas, Caribbean, and south Florida. They are also found in Central and South America. Mahogany is considered near threatened by the International Union for Conservation of Nature and Convention of Trade in Endangered Species (CITIES). Peruvian mahogany is cut in violation of CITIES and is illegal to possess. Mahogany trees support a diverse ecosystem of butterflies, moths, ants, beetles, flies, wasps, and bees.

While humans have built many beautiful things with mahogany lumber, including boats, the current situation of availability is a complicated global market. Please don't dispose of old mahogany boats! Enjoy your wood boat, take care of it, and prepare to let another caretaker do the same for many years to come.
