## PT 658 BOAT NEWS by Jack Coulter

The PT 658 all-volunteer crew, including CWC members Jack Coulter, Don Cameron, Ian Harding, and Todd Verboort, have been busy this spring completing important upgrades to the 78' Higgins Patrol Torpedo (PT) Boat and providing memorable experiences to donors and guests.

The engine room crew recently completed installation of the engine pre-oiling system to each of the three Packard 5M-2500 V12 propulsion engines. The new system included installation of small scavenging pumps to the engine lube oil system. By operating this pump, engine oil pressure builds up prior to starting.

Previously each engine needed to be cranked extensively, without ignition, to build up oil pressure before starting. The new system simplified the starting process and significantly reduced wear and tear on the engines. The oil pumps were generously donated by the manufacturer Motorque Corp. dba TurboWerx near Austin, TX.

The Portland Rose Festival and Fleet Week were June 4-9, when PT 658 completed three trips on the Willamette River. Each trip carried twelve invited guests including Ken Bakke and his daughter, Cindy Bakke, Mike Mayer, and Lea Gifford, all having the opportunity of a lifetime to be aboard the only fully restored and operational WWII PT boat underway at speed. Hearing the roar of all three 1945 Packard engines while the boat is traveling 30+knots is impressive!

These cruises required close coordination with Homeland Security, included meeting the Navy and Coast Guard Training Tall Ship USCGC Eagle en route to Portland's waterfront. The presences of a Canadian minesweeper, two US Guided Missile Destroyers, and the USCGC Tall Ship Eagle docked in Portland was an amazing sight.

In May, numerous members and their vessels spent several days of spring boating at a new rendezvous location, Lake Simtustus Resort (<u>lakesimtustusresort.com</u>), near Madras. Everyone enjoyed canyon views, smooth water, clear skies, and of course — food! Next year's gathering has been already set for May

## **MEMBER SPOTLIGHT** — DAN and LORA HECHT: A Lifetime on the Water

Dan and Lora Hecht are charter members of the CWC chapter of ACBS. This December, they will celebrate 60 years of marriage. They met while attending summer classes at Portland State University—not because they were behind, but because they wanted to graduate early. Dan launched an insurance business, Hecht & Hecht, with his brother, specializing in health and life insurance, while Lora devoted herself to raising their five children. Though they struggled financially, they never lost sight of their dream: living on the river and owning a boat. Managing a group of apartments provided a steppingstone—free rent and a salary. Eventually, they purchased a home with a place for a boat. One fateful day, Dan spotted a rough black painted wooden boat perched on 50-gallon drums. The owner wanted \$600, but Dan negotiated to \$300 and borrowed a trailer to bring it home. This was the start of a major restoration and the first step toward their boating dreams.

By 1972, the Hechts set their sights on a larger home, ideally on the river. Dan found a house inland, ready to seal the deal—until Lora discovered the perfect home on the Willamette River. The house had been vacant for two years and needed serious work. Lora took down the "For Sale" sign, and Dan drove straight to the bank. They secured the home for \$48,000, later transforming it into their beautiful riverside dream. Owning a home on the river provided lovely views and direct access to Portland's waterways but also came with risks. Most notable was the

great flood of 1996, which left 4 feet of water inside their home. True to form, they took it in stride and repaired the damage without hesitation.

As Dan's insurance business thrived, Lora immersed herself in volunteer work, leading urban walking tours for young students and out-of-town visitors. She also became a Mahjong expert, founding three Portland Mahjong clubs.

Dan and Lora's love for boating shaped cherished memories, from fishing and skiing to camping trips with their kids. Dan believes nothing feels better than a wooden boat on the water, and Lora recalls people lining up just to ski behind their boat, drawn to the wake it produced. Their passion for mahogany was contagious, leading to a growing fleet that included both wooden and plastic boats. For years, they braved deep waters on their 44'Tiara, reveling in offshore fishing adventures. Their prized collection includes: 1956 Chris-Craft Continental 23' — Splish Splash (Hercules 6 158), 1959 Chris-Craft Continental 18' — Hex-a-Float (Crusader 8 350), 1943 Chris-Craft Continental 18' — Splash (Chris-Craft 6 104).

Their love for boating has been passed on to their children and grandchildren. Their grandson, Jackson, is now the chapter's youngest member, working with Mike Mayer to continue the Hecht family legacy. As Dan says, "Wooden boats are just classy. People love to see them on the water."
