Jack Coulter continues his lifelong connection to boating by agreeing to be CWC's Weekday Cruise Director for 2026. Jack has been involved in boating as long as he can remember, from boating with his family growing up in Michigan, building a popular mechanics 8' hydro as an early teenager, racing APBA outboards, working as a Mercury outboard mechanic, and joining the U.S. Navy. His time in the Navy led to an interest in sailing as he assisted in the completion of a 45' ferrocement ketch that eventually sailed to Tahiti.

After earning a degree in mechanical engineering, he worked for the U.S. Navy as a civilian engineer in Ship

Building, Conversion & Repair in San Francisco. He also worked in oil and gas pipeline valve design and manufacturing, where he a met a fellow sailor. This led to crewing on race boats in the Bay Area and which also led to purchasing a 38' Stephens Farallone Clipper wooden sloop (pictured on Page 5) that he owned for many years.

After moving to Oregon, one more sailboat that he restored and raced (a 32' Ericson), was in his future. That boat has since been passed on to another captain.

The Oregon State Marine Board will be emailing motorboat registration renewal notices



to boaters who have email addresses on file whose registration expires on December 31, 2025. Each renewal notice is unique to the owner and their boat.

Owners are encouraged to take advantage of the online renewal option, and the email has detailed instructions for using the Boat Oregon Store. For boaters who do not have an email address on file with the agency, renewal notices will be sent via U.S. Mail and should arrive by mid-November.

## FROM BLUE WATER TO BROWN: A Captain's Tale

At the recent Butteville General Store event, a fantastic presentation was made by **Jesse Haas** (photo at right), someone who truly embodies the meaning of hard work, perseverance, and dedication to his craft. He entertained the crowd with stories of adventures on the water, both near and far.

Jesse is a professional boat captain whose maritime journey began at age 19, when he took a summer job as a cook on a tugboat from Seattle to Alaska. He hated that first trip and swore he'd never step on a tugboat again — but fate had other plans.

The following summer, out of money and opportunity, Jesse reluctantly took the same job again. This time, he fell in love with life at sea and decided to pursue a career as a merchant marine.

By age 24, Jesse earned his first captain's license and began towing boats to the boatyard

in San Diego. After three years of hands-on experience, he qualified as mate on a large ocean-going tug and joined Sause Brothers, running 130-foot tugs from the West Coast to the East Coast via the Panama Canal — even weathering four named hurricanes, including Katrina.

In 2006, Jesse joined Bernert Barge Lines, mastering the challenging Columbia River route from Astoria to Lewiston.


Today, he serves as a Senior Captain, Board Member, and Coast Guard Examiner, continuing to mentor the next generation of mariners.

What connection does Jesse have with CWC-ACBS? In his spare time, Jesse captains the largest boat in the Chapter's fleet — PT 658. Many of our members have had the pleasure of joining him as he handles this historic boat on the Willamette and Columbia rivers. If you happen to meet Captain Jesse on the water (or any other tug with a barge), please pass behind the tug and barge rather than in front and give them plenty of room.

### TWO FAQS ANSWERED by the ACBS Website

Just how old does a boat need to be to be considered a classic boat?

- **Historic:** A boat built up to and including 1918.
- Antique: A boat built between 1919 and 1942.
- Classic: A boat built between 1943 and 1975.
- Late Classic: A boat built 1976 to the year 25 prior to the current year.
- **Contemporary:** A wooden boat built within the last 25 years.

My boat is old enough to be a classic, but it is fiberglass or aluminum. Is that a problem?

No — as long as your boat is over 25 years old it qualifies as a classic boat. Actually, fiberglass and aluminum boats are a rapidly growing source of members in the ACBS community. Both are relatively inexpensive and offer both challenges and benefits to their owners. No matter what your boat, you will always find members that share your particular interest.
